Initially venturing to Hunterdon County as weekenders seeking a reprieve from the city they eventually saw that it was, in fact, much more than they imagined. Like many of those reading this newsletter, they agreed it would be an idyllic place to raise their family and as a mother of two young children twenty-five years ago, Jean saw the need for an education foundation to help bridge the gap between the needs of our schools and the limited state funding available for our district. As with all great ideas, the seed was planted, and the TEF was born.

The goal was, and still is, quite simple: to generate and distribute funds to establish, enhance and expand educational opportunities for students in Tewksbury Township school district. Since 1996, the TEF has contributed over \$1.6 million to Tewksbury schools in support of programs that have provided, and will continue to provide a meaningful, long-term impact on the entire school community. Our dedicated administrators, tireless volunteers and generous donors have attributed to the TEF's incredible success.

As with many great ideas, often there is a by-product that exceeds expectations. An unintended consequence of the TEF's fundraising efforts began 25 years ago...on the corner of Lamington Road and County Road 517, at the Dewey Farm. Program SpotlightHistory of the Earth with John Miller

March 17, 18 and 20th - 4th Grade



Each class will participate in a three-day adventure across New Jersey's geologic time. Each class will make a large wall model of NJ from millions of years ago. The models will show where the continents and NJ were, how they fit together and how they slowly drifted apart. Each NJ wall model will be displayed in the hall so that everyone can see the changing of NJ. John Miller will show students the many different fossils that he's found in NJ. Students will learn how and where these creatures lived providing further evidence that NJ has changed over time. Students will research and add animals from their time period to their model NJ. Finally, student will learn about NJ Mountains that were taller than the Rockies, Glaciers that were miles long, Lava flows that covered the land & the Atlantic Ocean
